The Museum of Kraków is carrying out the project "Talk Kraków", which aims to collect and make available various aspects of intangible cultural heritage from the area of the Kraków agglomeration. The residents together with experts create a base of all phenomena present in Kraków, to enrich the knowledge about the city and its traditions, folklore, customs, exceptional people or regionalisms. It is also a way of activating the inhabitants, encouraging the younger generation to talk to their older relatives about their family history and traditions, about outstanding Kraków's individuals or celebrities, typical Kraków or local names.

The idea is to reach for a common history. Together we will explore our current celebrations and customs and consider what is important to us because of the memory of our ancestors and places inscribed in the history of our own family. Each district has its own stories and colorful characters.

The stories of the inhabitants, but also sound files, photos and lyrics of literary works or songs connected with our city, thanks to a special portal, are saved and collected by the Museum of Kraków. It is also easy to access these resources - thanks to the map and a simple search engine, one can easily add or find interesting stories and get to know the curiosities of the area.
